The call to public life:

RESHAPING EUROPE

After the elections on 26 May 2019, we will know the make-up of the newly elected European Parliament and in October of this year we will take time out in Brussels to reflect on how to shape our action as Christians to help Europe navigate the challenges it is facing. In that respect, responding to the call to engage in public life is a way to help shape another Europe.

Public life exists because of the conflicting viewpoints and interests to be found in every society. It enables people to live with present realities which they do not want in the hope of getting what they want in the future. It also enables people to adjust and learn new ways without being coerced. Public life cannot survive without a shared conscientious engagement with issues which are seen by all to be of common concern.

To be conscientious is to see ourselves as accountable to a greater reality than our own egos – something spiritual and mysterious in the sense of being partly, but never fully, assessable. When we see this sense of conscience in others, it commands our trust.

This awareness of the spiritual is also a source of passion and determination. Without it, nothing of any consequence can happen but, unchecked, passion can turn into fanaticism. There is a time for the passion of outrage – for protest and condemnation – but without moments of civil conversation, outrage only compounds mistrust and mutual hostility. Political opponents need to seek out shared values and to debate in a manner which appeals to those values.

Civility is thing of the surface, a veneer, which depends very much on inherited forms. New ideas and technologies can render 'old ways' obsolete. Civility is fragile and, in changing times, ways of civility need to be adapted. One reason for the lack of civility in social media is that it is like a new frontier in which the inhabitants have not yet managed to establish mutually respectful social mores.

Even at the best of times, the superficiality of civility does not mean it is trivial. Beneath this surface lie all kinds of passions and irrationality and when it is peeled away – like skin – what we see is something raw and bloody. Leadership today is about finding ways to make people civil and respectful. Without this, public life will remain ineffectual.

To be engaged, aware of huge problems in our society:
how do we achieve our goals in political life?
